Defining Documents in World History: The 19th Century surveys key writing and documents produced from 1801-1900. Maps are included to help the reader further understand the state of the world during this pivotal era. This title contains 61 articles that provide a more dynamic and accurate look at the century that was known for the Industrial and French Revolutions as well as the rise of Communism.

These volumes investigate important historical documents from a diverse range of writers on a broad spectrum of subjects Napoleon Bonaparte, the Louisiana and Alaska purchases, and the middle class. Readers will find in-depth analysis of a broad range of documents, historic events and speeches from leaders that shaped these ideals and movements. This wide span of coverage within *Defining Documents in World History: The 19th Century* is organized under four broad categories:

- **Europe**, including the Concordat, Treaty of Paris, Battle of Navarino, publication of *Les Misérables*, an Account of the Irish Potato Famine, *The Communist Manifesto*, and Convention with Respect to the Laws and Customs of War on Land.
- **Asia**, including Convention of Kanagawa, the Meiji Charter, China's Hundred Days' Reform, and Theodore Herzl's call for the establishment of a Jewish state.
- **Africa**, including Firman of Appointment of Muhammad Ali as Pasha of Egypt, the Mahdi Uprising in Egypt and Sudan, The Death of General Gordon at Khartoum, and the Fashoda Crisis.
- **America**, including the Louisiana Purchase Treaty, the Haitian Declaration of Independence, the Monroe Doctrine, the Treaty between the United State and Great Britain for the Suppression of the Slave Trade, and a letter from Queen Liliuokalani to President Benjamin Harrison.

Each document is supported by a critical essay, written by historians and teachers, that includes a Summary Overview, Defining Moment, Author Biography, Document Analysis, and Essential Themes. Readers will appreciate the diversity of the collected texts, including journals, letters, speeches, political sermons, and laws among others. An important feature of each essay is a close reading of the primary source that develops evidence of broader themes, such as author's rhetorical purpose, social or class position, point of view, and other relevant issues. In addition, essays are organized by section themes, listed above, highlighting major issues of the period, many of which extend across eras and continue to shape life as we know it around the world.

Each section begins with a brief introduction that defines questions and problems underlying the subjects in the historical documents. A brief glossary is included at the end of each document, highlighting keywords that are important in the study of the primary source. Each essay also includes a Bibliography and Additional Reading section for further research.
