Defining Documents in World History: The Middle East spans the history of the region and includes a variety of documents from several eras. Maps are included to help the reader further understand the area throughout its existence. This title contains **57 articles** that provide a more dynamic and accurate look at this significant region of the world for a variety of political, economic, and religious reasons.

The material is organized under four historical groupings:

- **-Early, Medieval, and Early Modern History,** starting with the revolt of the Maccabees in 141 BCE, the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem by the Romans, and several passages from the fourteenth-century travels of Ibn Battuta, including his pilgrimage to Mecca and travels to Baghdad, Cairo, Damascus, Jerusalem and Mali.
- **-Ottoman Endurance and Collapse traces the Ottoman Empire,** starting with the treaty of Ku-chuk Kainardji, describes the Battle of Navarino and the siege of Kandahar and on to the call for the establishment of a Jewish state, the Sykes-Pi-cot agreement, the Balfour Declaration, and the Palestinian Mandate.
- **-Twentieth-Century** Troubles begins with the White Paper of 1939 and the Charter of the Arab State, the Truman Doctrine speech, while the cen-tury draws to a close with the Ayatollah Khomei-ni's speech about "The Great Satan," the Egypt-Israel Peace Treaty, and the Oslo Accords.
- **-Recent Realities** bring the set into the twenty-first century by examining documents such as George W. Bush's address to the nation concern-ing military operations in Iraq, the U.N. Security Council's 1973 resolution on Libya, and the Syria Report by the Human Rights Watch.

Each document is supported by a critical essay, written by historians and teachers, that includes a Summary Overview, Defining Moment, Author Biography, Document Analysis, and Essential Themes. Readers will appreciate the diversity of the collected texts, including journals, letters, speeches, political sermons, and laws among others. An important feature of each essay is a close reading of the primary source that develops evidence of broader themes, such as author's rhetorical purpose, social or class position, point of view, and other relevant issues. In addition, essays are organized by section themes, listed above, highlighting major issues of the period, many of which extend across eras and continue to shape life as we know it around the world.

Each section begins with a brief introduction that defines questions and problems underlying the subjects in the historical documents. A brief glossary is included at the end of each document, highlighting

keywords that are important in the study of the primary source. Each essay also includes a Bibliography and Additional Reading section for further research.
