## **Salem Press Announces the Sixth Volume in the Brand-New Series *Countries, Peoples & Cultures: Eastern & Southern Africa***

*Countries, Peoples & Cultures: Eastern & Southern Africa* is the sixth volume of a new nine-volume series from Salem Press. *Countries, Peoples & Cultures* offers valuable insight into the social, cultural, economic, historical, and religious practices and beliefs of nearly every country around the globe. With nine comprehensive, up-to-date volumes spanning every major world region, this in-depth reference source is one of the most thorough compilations of its kind on the market today.

The continent of Africa is traditionally divided into five, or sometimes six, major regions. This title focuses on Eastern and Southern Africa which is comprised of 23 nations. Eastern Africa is made up of the following countries: Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Somalia, and South Sudan (all of the Horn area and inland), along with, below the Horn, Burundi, Comoros, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Rwanda, Seychelles, Tanzania, and Uganda. In Southern Africa, the countries consist of: Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

One feature of the African continent as a whole is the vast plateau that makes up most of it. The southern and eastern half of the plateau generally stands above 3,000 feet, compared to the northern and western portion that has elevations of 500 to 2,000 feet. Few areas rise above 7,500 feet besides Mount Kilimanjaro (over 19,000 feet) and other high peaks that are associated with volcanic activity, such as mount Meru, Kenya, and Elgon. Although most of Eastern and Southern Africa consists of tropical and temperate grassland, most of the Horn region is characterized by a steppe and desert environment. Much of the environment is unfavorable to agriculture. Moreover, because of population growth, drought, environmental degradation, and political corruption, food shortages and outright famine have occurred frequently. The worst famines in recent times have been associated with wars in addition to one or more of these other conditions. There are no fewer than 1,000 different and mutually unintelligible languages spoken in Africa, perhaps as many as half of them spoken in the eastern and southern regions. This situation has hindered communication between the various African peoples, since people living relatively close to one another may speak an entirely separate language. Traditional Africa is composed primarily of rural dwellers situated in small villages or dispersed hamlets and of semi-nomadic peoples. This picture has begun to change in recent years, as urbanization has become an increasingly dominant trend.

Each profile also includes full color photographs, valuable tables of information—such as “Do You Know?” facts—and a comprehensive Bibliography.

Additionally, two helpful appendixes are included. Appendix One contains information about **World Governments**, focusing on 21 different types of governments found around the world today, from Commonwealth to Treaty System. Every profile includes sections detailing the government's Guiding Premise, Typical Structure, Role of the Citizen, and Modern-Day Examples. Appendix Two profiles **World Religions**, concentrating on 10 of the world's major religions, from African Religious Traditions to Sikhism. Each profile in this appendix includes information on the religion's Number of Adherents, Basic Tenets, Major Deities, Sacred Texts, Major Figures, Major Holy Sites, Major Rites & Celebrations, Origins, and more. Finally, a scholarly **Introduction** by the Editor and an alphabetical **Index** are also provided for the reader's convenience.
