
Defining Documents in American History: Voters' Rights

"Finding primary sources for teaching or research is much easier now when using the internet, but matching them with quality supplementary material can be more challenging. The "Defining Documents in American History" series aims to help by bringing everything together in one place, which is very helpful. This volume brings together 43 expert contributors who examine 45 documents. Each section begins with a summary overview followed by a description of why the document in question marked a defining moment in history, a biographical statement on the author(s), the actual text of the document, a document analysis, a discussion of the document's essential themes, and a bibliography of relevant books. Nothing here is too long or dense, making it perfect for giving students a first understanding of important documents. This publication is a companion to the voters' rights volume (2019) in Grey House's "Opinions throughout History" series. One can imagine using these two collections as the basis for a class unit or course readings. Ordering directly from the publisher provides an electronic version through the Salem Press portal in addition to the print volume. Suitable for all readers.
