

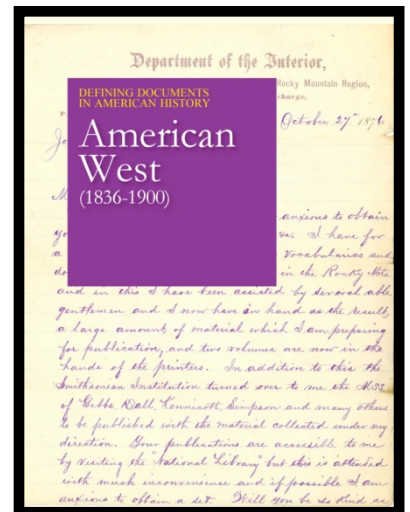
Defining Documents in American History: The American West (1836-1900)
