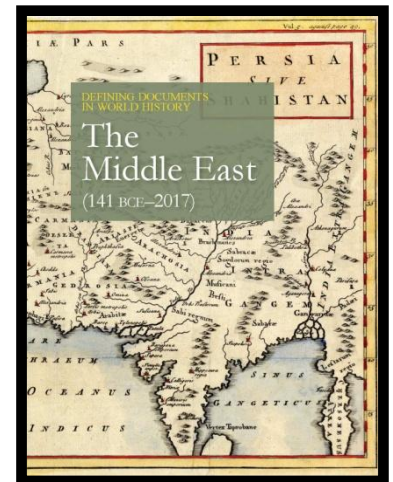


Defining Documents in World History: The Middle East

“The world’s first civilizations started in the Middle East; the region is the origin of all three major Abrahamic faiths. It is at the crossroads of East and West and, in recent times, is the major source of world oil. Trying to portray the people in the Middle East (who define themselves by language, religion, geography, and cultural traditions) through primary documents in two just volumes is a Sisyphean task, but the small selection collected here is not intended to be complete. This work **highlights 58 documents** from the Maccabees Revolt in 141 BCE to President Donald Trump’s speech in 2017 about moving the U.S. embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. **The layout of each chapter (one per document) aptly outlines good historical analysis.** Like other works from the Defining Documents in World History series, each essay starts with an overview, the impetus for writing, and a thumbnail biography. Following the primary document (complete or partial) is a document analysis and summary of recurring themes, followed by additional resources. **An excellent resource for high-school history courses.**”
